

GRAM PANCHAYAT MEMBERS SATISFACTION SURVEY REPORT Feedback collected during 2018-19



Gender Distribution of Gram Panchayat Members: Male and Female


The analysis revealed that members of various gram panchayats who participated in the study has both male and female representation. The male members representation is higher which stands at 58%, while the female members represent 42%.




Age Distribution of Gram Panchayat Members: 50 Year & Below and Above 50 Years

The study revealed that most of the gram panchayat members are above 50 years of age. The representation of gram panchayat members above 50 years stand at 73% and gram panchayat members 50 years & below stand at 27%.


Education Level Distribution of Gram Panchayat Members: Intermediate & below and Graduate & above



The analysis of gram panchayat member satisfaction survey revealed that members who had a larger representation in the survey were of graduate and above education level. Member with an educational qualification of intermediate & below represents 70%, while member with an educational qualification of gradation & above represents 30%.



Employment Status Distribution of Gram Panchayat Members: Working and Nonworking It was found in the survey that the working occupation status distribution of gram panchayat members represents 27%, while gram panchayat members who are non-working represents 73%.




Place of Residence Distribution of Gram Panchayat Members: Rural and Urban

The analysis of gram panchayat member's satisfaction survey revealed that members who participated in the survey were almost evenly represented in terms of their place of residence. Members who's place of residence falls under urban area represent 21%, while the members who's place of residence falls under rural area represents 79%.

The tool formulated for the satisfaction study of gram panchayat member of various villages where the Uttarakhand Open University study centre are situated, consists of a five-point summated scale, where the degree stands between 1 to 5. 1 stands for 'Strongly Disagree', 2 stands for 'Disagree', 3 stands for 'Neutral', 4 stands for 'Agree', and 5 stands for 'Strongly Agree'. The satisfaction survey tool consisted of 7 statements and the gram panchayat members were asked to rate their opinions.


The data for the satisfaction survey was collected in a span of 2 academic years 2019-20 and 2020-21.

1. Open and Distance Learning Education System Is Good





Gram panchayat members who showed agreement represented 31% of the survey, while gram panchayat members who showed a strong agreement represented 24% of the survey. 2. Open and Distance Learning Education System Has Made Education Accessible TO The Village People





3. Open and Distance Learning Education System Has Provided Job Opportunities for The Village People






4. UOU Provide Sufficient Help to The Village People





showed disagreement represented 15% of the survey, while gram panchayat members who showed a strong disagreement represented 12% of the survey.




