Introduction

The three-day workshop on "Development of NCVET Qualifications and Skills for State Open Universities" was jointly organized by Uttarakhand Open University (UOU) and the Commonwealth Educational Media Centre for Asia (CEMCA). Held from 19th to 21st June 2024 at the UOU campus in Haldwani, the workshop aimed to empower the State Open Universities (SOUs) to develop and implement skill-based education in alignment with the objectives of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. This initiative is critical for increasing the Gross Enrollment Ratio (GER) in India from 28% to 50% by 2035, as envisioned in NEP 2020. Currently, SOUs contribute 11.5% to the total GER, making their role indispensable in achieving these targets.

The workshop saw active participation from representatives of 15 State Open Universities across India. It provided a platform for these institutions to collaborate and share insights on developing unique qualifications required for dual recognition by the National Council for Vocational Education and Training (NCVET).

Objective

The primary objective of this workshop is to provide hands-on assistance to faculty members from 17 State Open Universities in developing unique NCVET qualifications. This workshop will ensure that each participating university can submit a comprehensive proposal for dual recognition to NCVET. The event will foster collaboration, knowledge sharing, and skill development among participants, contributing to the advancement of vocational education.

Day 1: 19th June, 2024

Registration and Networking

Time: 09:30 AM - 10:30 AM

The workshop began with the registration and networking session, setting the stage for a productive event. A total of 40 participants, including 10 female delegates, from 16 State Open Universities across India registered for the workshop.

Each participant was provided with a workshop kit, which included essential materials such as a detailed agenda, notepads, pens, and informational brochures. This kit was designed to facilitate engagement and note-taking throughout the sessions.

Inaugural Session

Time: 10:30 AM - 11:30 AM

The three-day workshop on "Development of NCVET Qualifications and Skills for State Open Universities" commenced on a high note with a dignified inaugural session. Held on the morning of June 19th, 2024, at the Uttarakhand Open University (UOU), Haldwani, the session was marked

by the presence of esteemed guests, insightful speeches, and a spirit of collaboration among the participants.



The inaugural session began with the ceremonial lighting of the lamp, symbolizing the dispelling of darkness and the ushering in of knowledge and enlightenment. This traditional act was performed by the key dignitaries present at the event:

In his welcome address, Prof. O.P.S. Negi extended a warm welcome to all the participants and highlighted the crucial role of Open Universities in enhancing the Gross Enrollment Ratio (GER) and aligning with the objectives of the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020.

Prof. Negi also emphasized the importance of developing qualifications that align with industry needs and the necessity of obtaining dual recognition from NCVET to offer skill-based courses effectively.



Dr. B. Shadrach delivered the opening remarks, focusing on the broader context of skill development in India and the significant role of tertiary education in preparing a skilled workforce. He emphasized that every sixth person in the world is an Indian. Under the Aatmanirbhar Bharat initiative of the Government of India, our aim is to develop a global workforce. Skills are nurtured from a young age, but it is at the post-secondary level that individuals are truly prepared to join the workforce. Therefore, the responsibility on higher education is immense. He highlighted the current GER in India, which stands at approximately 28%, and noted that 11% of this is contributed by the Open and Distance Learning system. Dr. Shadrach underscored the opportunity provided by NCVET for Open Universities to become dual awarding bodies, thus playing a crucial role in the skill ecosystem by offering both training and assessment for skill courses.



Workshop for development of Skills Qualifications at State Open Universities, 19-21 Jun 2024

Joining virtually, Shri Sailesh Bagauli, IAS, Secretary Higher Education, Uttarakhand Government, provided a thought-provoking address as the Guest of Honor. He pointed out that our country has a significant demographic dividend that can only be harnessed through a skilled workforce. The NEP 2020 emphasizes the integration of skill components into university curricula, and Open Universities are uniquely positioned to deliver these skills across states. Industry-aligned courses are essential, and we must focus on modular learning to accommodate students who need to balance education with work. He advocated for the development of online and modular courses to enable students to learn at their own pace and from any location. He also stressed the importance of integrating technology into education and shifting from traditional courses to those that focus on emerging technologies.



Shri Bagauli emphasized the potential of Open Universities to formalize the skills of the informal sector through the recognition of prior learning and awarding credits for informal learning. This, he noted, would help students advance in their careers and contribute to the economy.

Prof. P.D. Pant delivered the vote of thanks, expressing gratitude to all the dignitaries, participants, and organizing teams for their contributions and efforts. He acknowledged the seamless coordination by the ICT team, the diligent work of the organizing committee, and the support from the media in covering the event.



Tea/Refreshment Break: 11:30 AM - 11:45 AM

Session 1: Introduction to NCVET and Dual Recognition

Time: 11:45 AM - 01:30 PM



The first technical session of the workshop was conducted by Dr. B. Shadrach, Director of the Commonwealth Educational Media Centre for Asia (CEMCA). In his presentation titled "Introduction to NCVET and Dual Recognition," Dr. Shadrach elaborated on the pivotal frameworks and policies shaping the future of skill-based education in India.

Dr. Shadrach began by contextualizing the discussion within the broader national initiatives of **Aatmanirbhar Bharat** (Self-reliant India) and **Viksit Bharat** (Developed India). These missions underscore the Government of India's vision to foster a self-reliant economy and a globally competitive workforce. He emphasized that the alignment of education with these missions is crucial for empowering individuals with the skills needed to thrive in a rapidly evolving job market.

Dr. Shadrach then introduced the **National Education Policy (NEP) 2020**, which outlines the strategic vision for transforming India's education system. He highlighted how NEP 2020 promotes the integration of skill development within the academic curriculum and encourages innovative teaching and learning approaches.

To further enhance understanding, he covered several essential frameworks:

- National Higher Education Quality Framework: This framework ensures that higher
 education institutions maintain high standards in teaching, research, and community
 engagement.
- National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF): It provides a structured mechanism to map skills and qualifications to defined levels of learning and proficiency.
- **Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL)**: RPL acknowledges the skills and knowledge individuals have acquired outside formal education systems, enabling them to gain formal recognition and qualifications.
- National Occupational Standards (NOS): These standards specify the skills, knowledge, and understanding required to perform effectively in a particular job role.
- National Credit Framework (NCrF): NCrF facilitates the seamless integration of general and vocational education and allows for the accumulation and transfer of credits across different educational pathways.

Dr. Shadrach provided a comprehensive breakdown of the steps and considerations involved in developing qualifications under the NCVET framework. He highlighted key aspects such as:

- **Identification and Level of Qualifications**: The importance of clearly defining the level of qualifications to match industry requirements and educational standards.
- **Job Role and Learning Outcomes**: Defining specific job roles and the expected learning outcomes to ensure that the qualifications meet the needs of employers and learners.
- **Descriptors and Outline**: Crafting detailed descriptors and outlines that cover the scope and content of each qualification.
- **Sector Alignment and Duration**: Ensuring that the qualifications are aligned with relevant industry sectors and determining the appropriate duration for each course.
- **Infrastructural Requirements**: Identifying the necessary infrastructure and resources needed to deliver the qualifications effectively.

- **Delivery and Assessment of Qualifications**: Establishing robust delivery methods and assessment strategies to measure learners' competencies.
- **Industry Validation**: Securing validation from industry stakeholders to ensure that the qualifications are relevant and recognized.
- **Blended Learning Approach**: Emphasizing a blended learning approach to combine various modes of learning to enhance educational outcomes.

Dr. Shadrach elaborated on the **Blended Learning** model, which combines traditional classroom methods with modern digital tools and flexible learning opportunities. He detailed the seven key components of blended learning essential for a comprehensive educational experience:

- 1. **Theory and Lectures**: Delivering foundational knowledge and theoretical concepts to learners through lectures and other instructional methods.
- 2. **Soft Skills, Life Skills, Employability Skills, and Mentorship**: Fostering essential interpersonal and professional skills alongside academic learning.
- 3. **Practical Demonstration**: Providing hands-on demonstrations to help learners understand the practical application of their skills.
- 4. **Practical Hands-On Skills**: Engaging learners in lab work, workshops, and real-world scenarios to build practical competencies.
- 5. **Tutorials, Assignments, Drill and Practice**: Offering additional support through tutorials, assignments, and practice exercises to reinforce learning.
- 6. **Proctored Monitoring, Assessment, Evaluation, and Examination**: Implementing structured assessments and evaluations to monitor learner progress and certify competence.
- 7. **OJT** (**On-the-Job Training**), **Project Work, Internship, and Apprenticeship**: Facilitating real-world learning experiences through internships, apprenticeships, and project-based work.

Dr. Shadrach also discussed the tools and methodologies for assessing each component, ensuring a thorough evaluation of learners' skills and knowledge.

Concluding his session, Dr. Shadrach emphasized the importance of timely action. He set a clear deadline for all Open Universities to submit their applications for dual recognition from NCVET by **June 30, 2024**. This deadline is crucial for aligning with the upcoming UGC DEB regulations and positioning the universities to offer accredited skill-based courses that meet the NCVET standards.

Lunch Break: 01:30 PM - 02:30 PM

Session 2: Practical Workshop - Filling NCVET Application Forms

Time: 02:30 PM - 03:30 PM

The second session of the workshop, held from 2:30 PM to 3:30 PM, was dedicated to a hands-on practical workshop focused on the detailed process of filling out NCVET application forms for dual recognition. This session was crucial for the participants, providing them with practical knowledge and skills necessary to navigate the complexities of the NCVET application process.

Leading this session were Dr. Rabindranath Solomon from Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Open University (BRAOU), Hyderabad, and Dr. Anirban Ghosh from Netaji Subhas Open University (NSOU), Kolkata. Both the participants brought extensive experience and practical insights into the session, offering participants valuable guidance on the intricacies of the NCVET application process.

Dr. Solomon and Dr. Ghosh provided a step-by-step demonstration on how to complete the NCVET application forms. They meticulously covered each section of the form, ensuring that participants understood the detailed requirements for applying for dual recognition as both awarding and assessment bodies under the NCVET framework. Key areas of focus included:

- 1. **Institutional Details**: Entering accurate and comprehensive information about the university, including its history, mission, and existing accreditations.
- 2. **Qualification Details**: Providing detailed descriptions of the qualifications for which the university seeks recognition, including the alignment with the National Skill Qualification Framework (NSQF).
- 3. **Training and Assessment Capacity**: Documenting the university's capabilities in delivering training and conducting assessments, including infrastructure, faculty qualifications, and existing partnerships with industry.
- 4. **Compliance with NCVET Standards**: Ensuring that all aspects of the application align with NCVET's regulatory requirements and quality standards.
- 5. **Documentation and Evidence**: Compiling and attaching necessary supporting documents to substantiate the application, such as curriculum outlines, industry validation letters, and records of prior learning recognitions.

This practical session equipped the participants with the necessary tools and confidence to proceed with their applications, marking a significant step towards their universities achieving dual recognition and contributing to the broader skill development ecosystem in India.

Tea/Refreshment Break: 03:30 PM - 03:45 PM

Session 3: Open Discussion

Time: 03:45 PM - 04:15 PM

Participants were given the opportunity to engage actively with the facilitators, asking questions and seeking clarifications on various aspects of the form-filling process. Participants engaged in an open discussion, sharing their thoughts and challenges regarding the development of NCVET

qualifications. Dr. Solomon and Dr. Ghosh addressed common challenges and provided tips on how to effectively present the information to meet NCVET's criteria.



The session also included a hands-on practice segment where participants could start filling out the application forms with real-time assistance from the experts. This interactive component was particularly valuable, as it allowed participants to apply what they had learned immediately and receive feedback on their work.

The session concluded with Prof. Rajesh P. Khambayat encouraging participants to review and finalize their application drafts post-session. They stressed the importance of adhering to the NCVET deadlines and provided a timeline for the submission process.

Session 4: Understanding and Developing Skill-Based Qualifications

Time: 04:15 PM - 05:15 PM



The participants were encouraged to apply the principles discussed by revising their draft qualification proposals. They were tasked with refining their qualification outlines based on the

expert feedback received during the earlier sessions. This hands-on activity was crucial for consolidating their learning and preparing them for the next steps in the application process for dual recognition from NCVET.

Dr. Shadrach emphasized the importance of adhering to the submission timeline. He reiterated the necessity for all participating Open Universities to finalize and submit their applications for dual recognition to NCVET by June 30, 2024. This deadline is critical to ensure alignment with the upcoming UGC DEB regulations and to enable the universities to start offering skill-based qualifications promptly.

Day 2: 20th June, 2024


Free Time and Networking

Session 5: Skill Development and Vocalisation in Higher Education

Time: 10:30 AM - 11:30 AM



In Session 5 of the workshop on Skill Development and Vocationalisation in Higher Education, Prof. Rajesh P. Khambayat from NITTR Bhopal offered a comprehensive exploration into the integration of vocational education within mainstream higher education frameworks. He underscored the phased approach necessary for this integration, emphasizing its importance in maintaining academic standards while incorporating practical vocational skills. Prof. Khambayat

elaborated on the critical task of mapping vocational job roles under the National Skills Qualification Framework (NSQF), a pivotal step towards ensuring that educational programs align effectively with industry needs.

Throughout the session, he highlighted the significance of this alignment in bolstering the employability of graduates and facilitating their seamless transition into the workforce. Prof. Khambayat also underscored the role of higher education institutions in fostering an environment conducive to skill development, advocating for partnerships with industries to enhance curriculum relevance. The session concluded with a discussion on the challenges and opportunities associated with vocationalisation, encouraging participants to innovate and collaborate across sectors to advance skill development initiatives in higher education.

It was followed by the presentation of the application form filled by the representatives of the 15 state open universities. The experts provided the valuable feedback and based on the feedback, final adjustments were made in the application form.

Session 6: Discussion on Designing Skill-Based Qualifications

Time: 11:45 AM - 01:30 PM

In Session 6 of the workshop, titled "Discussion on Designing Skill-Based Qualifications," expert Prof. Rajesh Khambayat from NITTR Bhopal provided a detailed exploration into the intricacies of designing qualifications aligned with the National Skills Qualification Framework (NSQF) and National Credit Framework (NCF). Prof. Khambayat meticulously elucidated each section of the NCVET (National Council for Vocational Education and Training) application form, emphasizing the importance of clarity and specificity in defining job roles, learning outcomes, and assessment criteria.



He guided participants through the process of identifying and articulating the essential elements of a skill-based qualification, including its alignment with industry needs, duration, delivery mechanisms, and assessment protocols. Prof. Khambayat underscored the significance of integrating theoretical knowledge with practical application, ensuring that qualifications meet the standards required for workforce readiness and career progression.

Throughout the session, he facilitated discussions on best practices and methodologies for developing robust qualification frameworks that enhance employability and meet the evolving demands of the job market. Participants engaged in interactive exercises aimed at refining their understanding of the NCVET framework and its application in designing qualifications that contribute effectively to national skill development goals.

By the end of Session 6, participants gained valuable insights into the strategic aspects of qualification design, equipped with practical knowledge to refine and finalize their submissions for dual recognition under NCVET. The session concluded with a call to action for participants to leverage their newly acquired knowledge to innovate and elevate the quality of skill-based education across their respective institutions and regions.

Lunch Break: 01:30 PM - 02:30 PM

Session 7: Experience Sharing by the Participants

Time: 02:30 PM - 03:30 PM

Session 7, titled "Experience Sharing by the Participants," served as a pivotal moment for the workshop attendees to actively engage in collaborative learning and feedback. Following the detailed presentation and discussion in Session 6 on designing skill-based qualifications under the NCVET framework, participants took the opportunity to clarify doubts and seek clarification on various aspects of qualification development.

During this interactive session, each participating institution shared their initial drafts of the qualifications they had developed over the course of the workshop. Participants presented their concepts, outlining the key components such as job roles, learning outcomes, assessment methodologies, and industry relevance. This sharing enabled a cross-pollination of ideas and approaches among the diverse group of Open University representatives present.

Expert facilitators and peers provided constructive feedback on the presented drafts, offering insights and suggestions aimed at enhancing the clarity, alignment with industry standards, and overall effectiveness of the qualifications. Discussions were focused on refining the qualifications to ensure they meet the rigorous standards required for dual recognition as both awarding and assessment bodies under NCVET.

The session fostered a collaborative environment where participants learned from each other's experiences, benefited from collective expertise, and iteratively improved their qualification

designs. By the end of Session 7, participants were better equipped to finalize their qualification drafts, incorporating the feedback received to strengthen their submissions. The session underscored the workshop's commitment to enhancing skill development capabilities across State Open Universities, driving towards a more robust and responsive higher education ecosystem aligned with national skill development priorities.

Session 8: Walkthrough the Qualification Framework

Time: 03:45 PM - 05:15 PM



Session 8, titled "Walkthrough the Qualification Framework," aimed to consolidate the learning from previous sessions and prepare participants for the final stages of qualification development. Led by experts in the field, this session began with a comprehensive example of a well-prepared qualification under the NCVET framework. The example served as a benchmark to illustrate the key components and standards expected in the qualifications developed by the participants.

The experts provided a detailed walkthrough of the qualification framework, emphasizing critical aspects such as job roles, learning outcomes, assessment criteria, industry alignment, and the overall structure required for dual recognition. They highlighted best practices and common pitfalls to avoid during the final stages of qualification refinement.

Participants were encouraged to apply the insights gained from the example to their own qualification drafts. They engaged in discussions aimed at fine-tuning their submissions, addressing any remaining uncertainties, and making final adjustments based on the feedback received throughout the workshop.

An important objective of Session 8 was to prepare participants for the upcoming final presentation scheduled for the third day of the workshop. They were advised on effective presentation techniques, emphasizing clarity, coherence, and alignment with NCVET guidelines.

By the end of the session, participants were equipped with a clearer understanding of the qualification development process and were ready to refine their drafts for the final presentation. The session reinforced the collaborative learning environment of the workshop, where expertise and experience were shared to enhance the quality and relevance of skill-based qualifications across State Open Universities.

Day 3: 21st June, 2024

Celebration of International Yoga Day
